St. Matt's Midweek Update – 24th May 2024



I hope you are looking forward to the bank holiday weekend and to half term! Well done to all those taking GCSEs and A-Levels - you're halfway there!!

This week I read something that really resonated with me and that is a really important truth for us to know as Christians.

And that is that God doesn't make bad things happen to us, but he can always use those bad things for good.

We are sometimes misinformed, or it is implied by well-meaning people, that God makes bad things happen, or that there has to be a reason for everything that happens. I don't believe that is the case. I definitely don't think that God makes bad things happen to us or that these things happen because we've done something wrong or been a bad person. That is not who God is and that takes away grace and forgiveness and love.

The verse in the Bible that jumps out when we think about this is Romans 8:28... "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose."

That verse is often taken out of context, but if you go back and look at the rest of the chapter, we see the tension and the struggle between the flesh and the Spirit. The world we live in is broken, and we are flawed people. There will be bad things and suffering and pain for as long as we are living in this inbetween age before Jesus returns again, and these things affect believers and non-believers alike.

But the chapter also talks about the freedom that comes with being loved and forgiven by God, and the comfort of having the Holy Spirit with us as we wrestle with the broken world and bodies we live in.

So it is in that context that Paul says that God works for the good of those who love him, with the understanding that bad things will happen, but God will still be working and moving and bringing his glory.

The chapter then finishes with the amazing truth that none of the brokenness of this world can separate us from the love of God - our good, kind and generous Father.
