
If you would like to be in the nativity, we suggest coming to church a bit early, so you can choose a costume and get ready.

Sam and Abby Baguma are our mission partners with MAF.

MAF Uganda have developed a link with CURE Children's Hospital in Uganda to enable children in South Sudan with neurological conditions to have life saving surgery. It's mostly children with hydrocephalus. So any money we raise will go to flying children and their parents to the hospital in Uganda to have the surgery. The surgery is also heavily funded so everyone can access it. One flight for 10 children and their parents costs \$7500, so by giving £60 you could give one child and their parent the flight to get the surgery they need.

There is also a change jar at the back of church with the inside of our giant Christmas card, so do sign that for your church family and give the money you would have spent on cards.



Kenward Trust are a Christian drug and alcohol rehabilitation charity, who run a rehab for men and women in Yalding, Maidstone.

They have recently opened 83 Colebrook Road in High Brooms as a 14-bed project for stage 2 residents who will stay with them for approximately 3 months whilst they continue their recovery journey. All residents must be in recovery and are tested regularly to ensure that they are not using drugs and or alcohol. Residents can then move on to their stage 3 move on projects, before resettling independently within the community.

Being a Charity they have had to put a lot of resource into renovating the building so they would welcome support in kitting out the building. They are currently looking for:

- A coffee table for the lounge
- Comfy chair for hallway
- A radio for the kitchen/dinning room
- Modern pictures/paintings to hang in communal spaces
- Board Games
- Books
- Christmas presents
