St. Matt's Midweek Update – 24th January 2025

I hope you have had a good week.



Over the last couple of weeks I have been trying to listen to the Lectio365 app a bit more and it has been focussing on the sermon on the mount in Matthew 5.

Jesus starts the sermon on the mount with the Beatitudes, the list of the kind of people who are blessed and the blessing they will receive.

Matthew 5:1-10:

Now when Jesus saw the crowds, he went up on a mountainside and sat down. His disciples came to him, and he began to teach them.

He said:

"Blessed are the poor in spirit,

for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Blessed are those who mourn,

for they will be comforted.

Blessed are the meek.

for they will inherit the earth.

Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness,

for they will be filled.

Blessed are the merciful,

for they will be shown mercy.

Blessed are the pure in heart,

for they will see God.

Blessed are the peacemakers,

for they will be called children of God.

Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness.

for theirs is the kingdom of heaven."

It is easy to read these verses and just skim over them, but a few things struck me as I was listening to Lectio.

All the things Jesus lists as reasons for a blessing are characteristics of a godly life, ways that we can be as people which the world often looks down on. These characteristics are basically what Jesus is like, so blessings come from trying to become more like Jesus.

Similarly, the blessings that Jesus is promising for this life of godliness are not earthly blessings like wealth or status or an easy life, but they are the blessings of heaven - mercy, comfort, righteousness, being called children of God. What Jesus was teaching the disciples was completely opposite to the way the world then, and the world now, thinks. It is a radical way of living and being but it brings blessings beyond anything we could imagine.

There has been an example this week of someone living this kind of kingdom life. Bishop Mariann Budde preached a sermon at President Trump's inauguration urging those present, and all of us listening, to live a life that shows mercy, that sees the value in those who are marginalised, meek and poor in spirit. She showed through her sermon that she is a godly woman who understands what it means to follow Jesus and showed incredible courage in expressing it when she did.

Let's pray for her as she will inevitably face persecution because of this, as Jesus goes on to say in the next verses. But let's also pray for ourselves, that we would see her example and live for Jesus in the same way, showing mercy, being peacemakers, being pure in heart, and bringing heaven to earth as we seek to become more like Jesus.

We will be baptising adults on Easter Sunday this year, as we often do. If you are interested in being baptised at Easter this year, then please speak to Chris or Hannah soon.


