These sessions are for anyone who is interested, and you may like to consider it if you are a regular volunteer at any of our groups.

Electoral roll - The electoral roll is like a membership of the church - it's a Church of England thing and being on the electoral roll of St. Matt's Church allows you to vote in meetings and to stand for roles like PCC or church warden. It is also a way of saying that St. Matt's is your church and you are invested in it.

Once every 6 years, we have to do a whole new electoral roll - so everyone has to sign a form to join the roll again, regardless of whether you were previously on it or not. That is happening this year!
