St. Matt's Midweek Update - 14th March 2025

How has your week been?



I didn't have anything jumping out at me this week to write, so I thought I'd have a look at the verse of the day on my Bible app. It's James 1:5:

"If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you."

On first glance I thought it was a good verse! We often don't know how to pray for something, or how to approach a situation, but God says to ask Him for wisdom. He won't always solve the problem for us, but he can give us wisdom to be able to work it out for ourselves with His guidance. The verses around this verse talk about us being tested and facing trials, and wisdom is the answer.

But when you look at this verse a bit more, there are a couple of little phrases which speak to us so much of who God is.

Firstly, God gives generously **to all**. We often think he gives more to others but not so much to me! Or we judge people and think they should be excluded from God's generosity. God gives generously to all. Remember we are talking about wisdom here, not money or success.

Secondly, God gives generously to all **without finding fault.** Like I was saying in my talk on Sunday, it is so easy to think God sees us as we see ourselves, with all our insecurities and self judgement. But when God looks at us, and gives to us, He doesn't find fault with us. He doesn't look at the times we've messed up before and think He can't trust us with anything else. He sees us as right and pure and lovely, because of the blood of Jesus.

So when we ask, we can ask with confidence, knowing that God will bless us and is working for good in our lives.
