St. Matt's Midweek Update - 21st March 2025

I hope you have had a good week.



Next weekend I have a big choir concert with the choir I sing in. We are joining up with other branches of the same choir for a 15th anniversary concert, and there will be about 200 people singing! I can't wait.

Singing in a choir is great - the sound that can be made with lots of people all singing together, and singing in harmony, is amazing.

There are a few things about singing in a choir that I think relate really well to us being church together.

In a choir, everyone's voices join together to make the whole sound. It isn't about any one person; it is about all the parts making the one sound. One person couldn't make the sound that a choir makes, so it needs everyone's voices to play their part.

You also each have your part to play in a choir, and we are not all singing the same thing. I am an alto, so I will often be singing a very different thing to the sopranos or the tenors, but it all contributes to the overall song.

No-one should stand out in a choir - generally if you are standing out then you are probably singing the wrong thing or singing too loud! The idea of a choir is to listen to each other and sing together to blend the sound, so it sounds like one beautiful harmony.

And lastly, being in the choir is about so much more than singing! It is great for giving you a boost and making you feel good; I have made friends and we go out for socials and do fun things.

All of these things can translate to being part of our church family and working together to share the good news of Jesus in High Brooms.

Church is not about any one person, and one or two people certainly wouldn't be able to do all the things we do as a church to share Jesus with others. It's about us all playing our part.

Your part is different to my part, but we all work together to make St. Matt's what it is. We each bring our bit of time, energy, gifts and money and it contributes to the overall ministry of the church.

Church is also about not standing out too much, but playing our part in the team we are in. It's about being aware of what other teams are doing and how we are all working together to share Jesus in our community. Every person and team is as important as all the others and is ultimately working towards the same goal - to be Jesus to those around us.

And hopefully, being part of the church family brings so much more than just going to church on a Sunday. It should bring joy and friendship and support. Serving makes us feel good, contributing gives us a boost. Being part of something bigger than ourselves is so good for us and encourages us in our walk with Jesus.
